You've through the valley, and now I want you to come up into the sunlight. I want you to start building a future on something solid, and that solid ground means being debt-free. If I woke up in your shoes, I'd get unbelievably aggressive about paying off this debt. I'm talking about rice and beans and living in a cheap little apartment for the next two or three years while you kill it

Whatever you do, Trevor, please don't get complacent about this debt. Lots of times people will play around with student loans. They don't take them seriously, because they have low payments or really low interest rates. The next thing you know, it's still sitting there 10 years later staring at you like some kind of big, dumb pet!

Having a bunch of mortgage payments hanging over your head would com-pletely destroy the foundation of your new financial life. Save up \$1,000 for a small emergency fund. Go crazy about paying off the loan. Then, get your emergency fund of three to six months of expenses in the bank. If you get used to living

on \$20,000 a year, and your income rises like you mentioned, you'll be able to get rid of your student loan fast. After that's done, you can save enough for a 20 percent down payment on a house in no time!

nicest, gentlest person has opinions. You'd be giving her a say in your lives in a different way and at a completely different level than ever before. You just don't need that in your life!


