Today, the tested and evidence-based program is available online, free to the public on the iGrow Healthy Families community.

"After five years of testing, we are excited for the public to use iGrow Readers because it provides opportunities to increase healthy eating and physical activity in young children, their families and their caregivers," said Suzanne Stluka, SDSU **Extension Food & Families** Program Director.

Like most great ideas, iGrow Readers was inspired by a teaching tool initially created by an SDSU Extension team member to teach preschoolers about healthy eating.

"Children love being read to," Stluka said. "Storybooks have long been an avenue to promote one of the foundations for early childhood & elementary education, which is literacy and today, SDSU Extension uses them to serve as a conduit to promote physical activity and nutrition.'

"Our transdisciplinary team spent five years testing the program to make sure it is evidence-based and ready for use in a multitude of avenues," Stluka said.

The resulting data showed children who participated in iGrow Readers were more likely to try new foods and ask their parents for nutritional items when they grocery shopped together.

"In the end, children became aware of nutritional information and have a more positive attitude toward healthy eating and increased physical activity," Wells said. Through iGrow Readers, parents, teachers and childcare providers can access the curriculum online for free. The only item they need to purchase or check out from their local library is the storybook.

'When we selected books, we made sure they were not only engaging and colorful, but readily available," Wells said.


iGrow Readers also includes eight Native American storybooks which come with Native American-focused lessons that in addition to healthy eating and physical activity, also promote Oceti Sacowin Essential Understandings for Native American programming.

An added benefit to iGrow Readers is that it can have a positive impact on an entire family

"Data showed that children can have an impact on parents' eating and activity habits because they request healthier foods when at the grocery store," Wells said.
