December 6

December 14

Gladys Merkwon, 89, of Yankton died from injuries she sustained in a mobile home fire yesterday, neighbors who alerted authorities spotted the fire.

December 15

The flag flow by U.S. forces in Iraq was lowered at the Baghdad airport ceremony marking the official end of the war that left 4,500 Americans and 110,000 Iraqis dead and cost more than \$800 billion.

December 17

Avera Sacred Heart Hospital is hoping to win the official bid for a 50 bed Veterans Home to be built here in Yankton. Currently the only facility in South Dakota is located in Hot Springs.

December 18

The last convoy of armored U.S. troops left Iraq crossing into Kuwait in darkness, the final moments of a nine-year war.

December 19

North Korean leader Kim Jong Il has died, he was 69. He inherited power from his father 17 years ago. North Korea has been grooming Kim's third son to take over power from his father. South Korea put its military on "high alert".

December 21

The U.S. Army Corp of Engineers did what they could with the record flooding that occurred on the Missouri River this year. Experts say climate changes are happening more frequently and are larger. The Corp said the flooding cost over \$630 million in damages to the levees, dams and channels built to control the river.

The Vermillion Guard unit has received its orders for deployment to Afghanistan in 2012. They have been on alert since last month.

December 26

December 27

A change in the state law will allow people to buy and shoot fireworks form December 28-31st.

Hundreds of people have been taking advantage of the unseasonably warm conditions to take holiday strolls across Meridian Bridge, Yankton flirted with a record high Monday, temperature at 54 degrees, three degrees short of the record of 57 degrees reached in 1963.

December 29

Nebraska Senator Ben Nelson has decided not to run for a third term. His decision not to run will automatically makes people think his seat will automatically go to the Republicans, who already hold the other four seats in Nebraska's congressional delegation.
