NMM Continues Fall Film Season With 'Shine'

VERMILLION — "Geoffrey Rush's Oscar-winning portrayal of pianist David Helfgott in the movie 'Shine' is genius, but whether David Helfgott's piano playing, in reality, was genius or possibly our fascination with mental illness, is a question that has been asked. In any case, 'Shine' is a brilliant film, and you shouldn't miss the chance to see it on the big screen," says Patricia Bornhofen, National Music Museum spokesperson.

That opportunity will be this Saturday morning, Sept. 26, at 10 a.m., at the Coyote Twin Theater, in downtown Vermillion, as the Museum continues its 2015 film series.

Each NMM movie is opened with a very brief introduction by a National Music Museum speaker. Susanne Skyrn, USD Professor of Music/Keyboards, will introduce "Shine."

The National Music Museum created the film series as a way to make contact with a more diverse audience and to show again how deeply and inextricably music is woven into our lives. People are then encouraged to go and explore the instruments that make that music, at the National Music Museum.

"In the case of 'Shine,' which centers on the piano, you can visit the NMM's fascinating collection of keyboards — from the earliest playable harpsichord, our circa-1530 'Neapolitan,' to the earliest known French grand piano — and so much more," says Bornhofen.

The NMM is showing its movies at the Coyote Twin Theatre. Partnering with the new Vermillion Theaters group, proceeds from NMM-movie admissions benefit the Museum. Next month, Saturday, Oct. 24, at 10 a.m., the NMM is showing the recently debuted documentary "Some Kind of Spark," a powerful film-festival winner about what happens when music education meets music-hungry, under-served kids. The final NMM fall movie, on Saturday, Nov. 21, at 10 a.m., will be the sunny 1999 documentary "Buena Vista Social Club" about a legendary ensemble of aging musicians united to record their classic Cuban rhythms again.

The Bookworm ... For Kids

'Hoops' Is A Slam Dunk

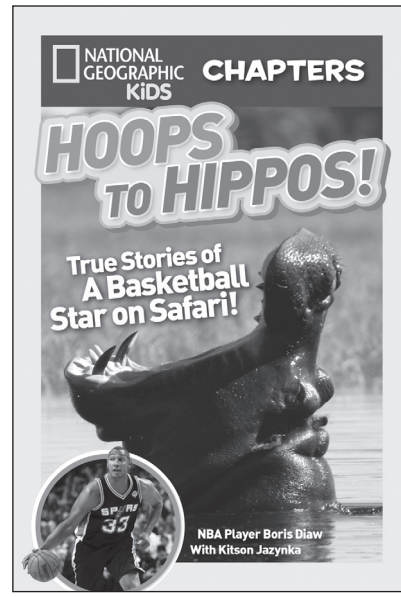
"Hoops to Hippos! True Stories of a Basketball Star on Safari!" By Boris Diaw with Kitson Jazyzka; © 2015, National Geographic Kids. 112 pages

Peanut butter and jelly. Bacon and eggs. Rock & roll. Mario & Luigi, whip & nae nae, Batman & Robin. Some things just naturally go together; they belong in pairs. And for NBA player and author Boris Diaw, there are two things he likes to add together. Read "Hoops to Hippos" (with Kitson Jazyzka), and see what they are.

A long time ago, when Boris Diaw was a little boy growing up in Bordeaux, France, his mother took him and his brother to Senegal to visit the boys' father. Neither Boris nor his brother, Marcus, had ever been to Africa and they were excited! Boris wanted more than anything to see wild animals in Africa; he bought a camera while he was traveling, and he hoped to take lots of pictures.

On that trip, he saw zebras and giraffes, monkeys, hippos, birds, and warthogs. He never saw lions or tigers then — but he wasn't done traveling! He still wanted to see the Big Cats but first, Diaw grew up to become a professional basketball player in France, then he moved to the U.S. to play for the San Antonio Spurs. After his rookie year in Texas, he returned



to Senegal again, to catch wild animals with his camera.

Diaw snapped pictures of hyenas and chameleons. He saw a herd of elephants and "noticed a baby elephant standing in between the legs of his mom. He was so small!" Hiking in the bush, he saw impalas and he played a traditional African bush game. Diaw was also startled by a huge African buffalo.

On later trips to Africa, Diaw saw lions

and rhinos, and he steered clear of hippos and crocodiles, both of which can run quite fast. He and his group were once stalked by a pack of hungry hyenas who wanted a piece of a basketball star! While in India, Diaw learned a lot about tigers before he saw a mother tiger and her cubs in the wild. And he noted how animals and basketball players have a lot in common: it's safer, easier, and sometimes more fun to work together as a team.

In your child's life, he'll have many interests. One of them may become her career but in "Hoops to Hippos," she'll see that it's possible to have many passions.

Though, obviously, basketball is a subject that author Boris Diaw (with Kitson Jazyzka) loves, wildlife and photography really are the focus of this book. In it, Diaw explains what it takes to hunt animals with his camera and, among tales of spotting creatures in their natural habitats, he also shares with young readers the thrilling adventures he's had on safari. Conservation-minded parents will be happy to know that Diaw also carefully explains why it's important to protect those animals he sees.

For young basketball fans and for 7- to 9-year-old animal lovers who are just starting to read chapter books, this one is a great pick-up. Filled with pictures, surprise, and fun, "Hoops to Hippos!" plus your child equals a very good match.

Street Corner Symphony Performs Oct. 1

These southern gents quickly won over Sing-Off judges Ben Folds (Ben Folds Five), Shawn Stockman (Boyz II Men), and Nicole Scherzinger (The Pussycat Dolls), and, most importantly, millions of NBC primetime viewers after demonstrating their unique, laid-back-yet-dynamic style of a cappella. Corner Symphony has made its mark on the music world, recording albums, providing clinics for schools, giving benefits for cancer, performing across the country and around the world, and even working with major artists including Ben Folds, Alison Krauss and Take 6's Claude McKnight.

The six performing members of the group include three brothers: Jeremy, Jonathan, and Richie Lister, along with Adam Chance, Mark McLemore and Kurt Zimmerman. Four of the six guys are the sons of ministers, which contributes to their natural

ears for harmony as well as their playful sense of mischief, and all six of them have expertise in a wide variety of styles. This allows Street Corner Symphony to seamlessly move between most styles of music, feeling at home in all of them.
